

Dear Parish Family, The Liturgy of the Eucharist The concluding rites of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass: we are to go

and proclaim.

The Greeting; we greet one another in the Lord as we prepare to go.

The Blessing: We receive the blessing of almighty God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The Dismissal: We are sent forth on our mission to proclaim the Gospel of the Lordand to bring the fruits of the Eucharist we have celebrated; namely, salvation to the world.

Do I go and proclaim?

Do I allow the Eucharist to transform me more and more into Christ so that I can go out into the world nourished by Jesus, the Bread of :ofe? Or do I go back to my former way of life - back to business as usual?

Do I proclaim the Good News that I have experienced in the Eucharist, namely, that God loves us and sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to save us from sin and death? Or do I remain silent, afraid to proclaim the truth of God's Love in the gospel and in Jesus?

Do I enter into the action of the Concluding Rites - going and proclaiming - by taking part in the mission of the Church: worship, evangelization, and care for the poor? Do I stay for the concluding rites, or leave right after communion, or get out of church as quickly as possible? Again, thanks to Rev. Christopher R. Seibt for this information. God Bless, Fr. Dan
