Light Our Future

The Campaign for St. Francis Xavier Church
Progress Update: The
Diocese's crew (Mike and Scott) continue to
make excellent progress.
The timber framing has been protected with new composite siding and the roofing process is well underway. The new
Bilco hatchway to the upper section of the

steeple has been installed and the "interior" roofing sealed. The louver materials are also in the process of being replaced with the composite material. The arch window screens have been powder coated and reinstalled. Barry Kennedy's team has roughed in the electrical work and they anticipate the lights being installed and functional within the next few weeks. One of the smaller lifts will be exchanged for a larger one to facilitate the servicing of the lightning protection system, the completion of the upper roof and the painting of the Cross. On a separate note, two very old pulleys from the upper reaches of the steeple were recovered by the contractors and given to John Curtin for placement in the historical society.
