# What is World Mission Sunday?

World Mission Sunday is an annual global celebration within the Catholic Church, observed on the second to last



Sunday of October. This special day is dedicated to the support of the missionary work of the Church through prayer and sacrifices.

#### Dear Parish Family,

As we come to the end of October and look to November, we are reminded by the natural world that life has stages:

there is a beginning, a middle and a natural end. This is also true for us; as Christians we believe that all stages of our lives are blessed. At the beginning we are created in the Divine Image and likeness, and, at Baptism, we receive the gift of Sanctifying Grace, become brothers and sisters of Christ, children of our Father, have Original Sin removed and become members of the Church, the Body of Christ. Throughout our lives, as we grow and mature, we experience God's grace in our lives through the Sacraments, prayer and the Scripture. At the end of our lives, we also receive God's promise: As Jesus said in the Gospel of John: "I go and prepare a place for you, for in my Father's house there are many rooms." And St. Paul reminds us: "Eye has not seen, nor has ear heard what God has in store for those who love Him. We celebrate the final stages of life as a church, first in the Solemnity of All Saints. This Holy Day of obligation is a great celebration that reminds us of the Communion of Saints, and all those, proclaimed and known only to God, who have come to the gift of the Beatific Vision, our Father's home, Heaven. The celebration of All Souls reminds us that those who have died, but are not yet ready for the ultimate experience of God in heaven are given the gift of being purified – we call this experience purgatory. St. Thomas Aquinas calls this experience the ultimate act of God's mercy. As a parish family, each year we gather at a special liturgy to commemorate all of our deceased loved ones who have gone before us in faith the past year. This year we will celebrate their lives together on November 8.
