# The Seven Sacraments (Confession)

This Sacrament is one of the greatest gifts God gives to us and, unfortunately, is one of the most ignored of all the Sacraments. Before His Passion and death, Jesus gave to His Church the authority to forgive sins and the epistle of John reminds us that we are all sinners, in fact it proclaims that he who says he is without sin has made God a liar. We cannot pay the price for our sin, Jesus has done that; we can acknowledge in humility that we are sinners and ask for forgiveness. Every sin has a public element. Sin is a disruption of or destruction of relationships: the relationship between the sinner and God, the relationship between the sinner and the Community of the Church, and the relationship between the sinner and his/her most authentic self; the person, by grace who God is calling the person to be and become. When I celebrate the Sacrament, I first take time to examine my life in light of the Ten Commandments, the Gospels and the teaching of the Church. I then approach the priest and Confess my sin, a penance is given, I make an act of contrition and then receive absolution. With the forgiveness of my sin the relationships that sin harms are restored. It is the Sacrament of Confession: I judge myself to be a sinner and confess my sin. I receive and perform my penance, not to make up for my sin, but to help me overcome the temptation of sin in my life. I am reconciled to God, the Community and my authentic self. Some of the most humbling and consoling words that are prayed is the prayer of absolution, the priest proclaims: "God, the Father of Mercies, through the Death and Resurrection of His Son has reconciled the world to Himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the Forgiveness of sin. Through the Ministry of the Church, may God give you pardon and peace. I absolve you of all of your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." God Bless,
