All Saints and All Souls

Dear Parish Family,

On November 1 the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints as a Holy Day of Obligation. On this day we

celebrate all the Saints, both those who are officially proclaimed by the Church and those who are not, yet still enjoy the experience of heaven. According to The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1023-1024): Those who die in God's grace and friendship and are perfectly purified live forever with Christ. They are like God for they "see Him as He is" face to face. This perfect life with the Most Holy Trinity - this communion of life and love with the Trinity, with the Virgin Mary, the angels and all the blessed - is called 'heaven.' Heaven is the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness.

On November 2 the Church celebrates All Souls Day, a day to commemorate all who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, and are indeed assured of eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. (Catechism of the Catholid Church 1030 -1031) From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic Sacrifice, so that purified, they may enter the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead. (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1032). God Bless, Fr. Dan
