We have our date for **Confirmation** for this spring: The Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated for our second year students on Thursday, April 21 at 7:00 PM with Bishop Lucia as our celebrant.

The Seven Sacraments (Anointing of the Sick)

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is a Sacrament of healing in the Epistle of James we read: "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the Church, and they should pray over them in the name of the Lord and anoint them in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven." James 5: 14-15 (NAB). Anyone who is ill, about to undergo surgery and/or advanced in years can receive this Sacrament. We believe in God's ability to heal physically, emotionally and spiritually. The ritual includes a reading from Scripture, the blessing of oil (or thanksgiving for the blessed oil) and the prayer of anointing; ."Through this holy anointing may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit" The person is then anointed on the hands with the sign of the cross saying, "May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up."

The oil we use in this sacrament is one of three Holy Oils that the Church uses in Sacramental celebrations. The oils are blessed for the entire diocese by the Bishop at a special Mass during Holy Week; the Chrism Mass. The Oils are: Holy Oil (Oil of Catechumen) used at Baptism. Sacred Chrism, used at Baptism Confirmation and Holy Orders, and Oil of the Sick, used in the Anointing of the Sick. If you notice the lighted box to the left of the Altar (the ambury) is where the oils are kept throughout the year, the ambury is emptied before Holy Week in preparation to receive the new oils.
