Immaculata Medallion Award

The Immaculata Medallion is an award recognizing and honoring lay people who generously and unselfishly volunteer time and service to their parishes.

On one side of the medal appears an image of the Immaculate Conception, the Patroness of the Diocese of Syracuse. The reverse features an image of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. The Immaculata Award was instituted in Dec. 2011 as a component of the celebration of the 125th Anniversary of the founding of the Diocese. Bishop Lucia accepted recommendations from pastors across the diocese, in consultation with their pastoral council, for recognition.
