Gaudete Sunday

Dear Parish Family, This past week I learned some wonderful things. On Sunday, during

my homily, a little child began to count: 1,2,3,4,5..10; it was innocent and perfect. On Monday at Mass for the Immaculate Conception another young child began to recite the alphabet, again, totally innocent and perfect. There are so many things that we should be happy and rejoice over, but nothing more than the pure joy, love, and innocence of a little child. This week we will light the pink candle on the Advent Wreath, joyful that our salvation is so near. We will also bless the creches from mangers and we will bless the "Bambellini" and have the infant Jesus available to go to our parish homes. It is a very good time to remember that the Baby Jesus is not just a play, plastic or paper-mache model that we take out once a year then put back into storage. Jesus was truly a human baby, (like us in all things but sin), he cried when he was hungry, needed a change or was 'fussy'. As he grew he learned to walk, and probably stumbled and fell, learned to talk and recite his prayers. As he grew, Joseph taught him the carpenter's trade; and ultimately Jesus began His public ministry and ended up on the cross, but was raised on the third day. On Christmas we celebrate the birth of Immanuel, God with us: Jesus Christ truly God and truly human. Sometimes we forget the humanity of Jesus, but He truly was, and is God and man. God Bless, Fr.
