Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday we begin Advent, and with Advent we begin another liturgical year. Advent is more than getting everything ready for the celebration of Christmas:

gifts, cards. decorations, etc. All of which are good, so long as they do not overshadow what Advent calls us to. Advent has a two-fold character: the preparation for the Solemnity of Christmas and the preparation for the coming of Christ at the end of time. The Old Testament readings of Advent are taken from the Prophets and express the hope of the people of Israel for the fulfillment of God's covenant. This promise is fulfilled in a way no one could have imagined: God sending Jesus, His only begotten Son; Jesus, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. The last weeks of Advent turn our attention from the Prophets' hope to the joyful expectation of John the Baptist and the Virgin Mary. As we proclaim: *Maranatha, Come Lord Jesus!* God Bless,
