Immaculata Medallion Award

The Immaculata Medallion is an award recognizing and honoring lay people who generously and unselfishly volunteer time and service to their parishes.

On one side of the medal appears an image of the Immaculate Conception, the Patroness of the Diocese of Syracuse. The reverse features an image of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. The Immaculata Award was instituted in Dec. 2011 as a component of the celebration of the 125th Anniversary of the founding of the Diocese. Bishop Lucia accepted recommendations from pastors across the diocese, in consultation with their pastoral council, for recognition. The St. Francis Xavier recipient of this award is: *Terry Kotlary*

The diocesan theme for **ADVENT** 2020 is *Waiting in Joyful Hope*. The season of Advent reminds us that God comes to us. During the first two weeks of Advent we prepare ourselves for when Christ will come again in glory at the end of time. During the second two weeks of Advent we prepare to celebrate when he came at Christmas. At the same time, we become more aware of the fact that God comes to us now. In this way, our very lives are "an Advent, a time of waiting, listening and hoping, a time of openness to the unimaginable gift of God" (Sister Maria Boulding, The Coming of God). Throughout Advent, throughout our lives, we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.
