

### Lenten Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence

**Days of Abstinence**: No meat can be eaten on Ash Wednesday and all of the Fridays during Lent. This applies to all Catholics 14 and older.

**Days to Fast**: Only one full meal is permitted on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for Catholics between 18 and 59. Two smaller meals are permitted, but the small meals should not equal a second full meal. Drinking coffee, tea and water between meals is allowed. Snacks between meals are not allowed.

One is not bound to fast if health or the ability to work is affected.



### Spiritual Toy

Dear parish family, This Wednesday we begin the season of Lent. For many, Lent has a negative connotation: giving up,

penance, obligation: while these can be a very important and beneficial part of one's spiritual journey; Lent is also a very positive season: a time to re-evaluate and perhaps re-spark my relationship with God and the Church. The transition practices of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving are meant to help us grow in love of God and love of neighbor. Prayer helps us to align our lives more closely with God and His loving plan; fasting can help us appreciate the many in our community and world who are in physical need, and almsgiving can help us understand that the great blessings that we have been given are also given to help others less fortunate than we. None of these are meant to make us 'grouchy' or 'sour'. As I remarked in my homily, that elementary school sister who told us: "There is no joy in religion." certainly did not appreciate the great joy of growing closer to God and our neighbor, even if that involved sacrifice. I often wonder why so many Christians seem unhappy? Why do they scowl, frown, or seem unhappy even while praying and/or celebrating the Eucharist. Jesus says (John 15:11): "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you, and your joy may be complete." As we hear... in the Gospel for Ash Wednesday: "When you pray do not be like the hypocrites, who love to stand and pray in synagogues and on street corners so that others may see them....When you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites."

What does all of this really mean? This Lent find a way to grow in your faith; your relationship with God and the Church. Perhaps begin praying together daily as a family, the Rosary is an excellent devotion for this, come to Mass one other day a week, visit a shut in or sick or elderly person. But whatever you choose for your Lenten Spiritual journey; do it with joy, a glad heart and a bright smile on your face. God Bless, Fr. Dan
