Uniquely Catholic

Dear Parish Family, Although there is a drawing movement to restore the unity of the Christian

family; there are still very significant things that separate the Catholic Church from Protestant and Evangelical Denominations. The most significant in my mind is the Catholic Belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist: we believe that the Eucharist becomes actually, literally, and completely the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, the Second Person of the Most Blessed Trinity. Other Christian churches profess the Eucharist to be simply a sign. symbol, or representation of Jesus. The Catholic Church professes the seven Sacraments; and the authenticity of forgiveness of sin through the Sacrament of Confession. The one Sacrament that Christians hold in common is Baptism, as long as the person being Baptized is done so with water and the name of the Trinity: Father Son, and Holy Spirit. There is a difference in the Canon of the Scripture (accepted Books of the Bible), usually with regard to the accepted books of the Old Testament, the Catholic Canon and Bible is longer than the Canon of Protestant Bible (that is why Catholics do not use the King James version). The Catholic Church holds Marv. the Mother of Jesus in very high regard. While we DO NOT worship Mary, we do vernerate her as the Mother of Jesus. We profess that Mary is and was a virgin, before, during and ever after the conception and birth of Jesus. The Catholic Church teaches that Mary is the co-mediatrix of grace: Mary is not the source of grace (only God is), but through her intercession God can and does give grace. Catholics also profess the Communion of Saints and the belief in Purgatory. Another important distinction is the office of the Pope; who as Vicar of Christ on earth holds Supreme and infallible authority when it comes to matters of Faith and Morals: Pope Francis can trace this Papal Ministry, unbroken, back to St. Peter, the First Pope. These are a few elements of our Church that make us 'uniquely Catholic.'

There are many things that all Christians hold in common, the chief of which is our belief in the Most Holy Trinity, with Jesus as our Lord, Savior and Redeemer. In Marcellus we have a strong and active Ecumenical Conmittee, working to foster Christian unity in our common beliefs, acts of Mercy, Charity and Justice, and a very good relationship among the pastors of the village. As Christians we gather together for prayer on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, Thanksgiving, and the National World Day of Prayer; we support one another in times of need or sorrow, work together for the common good, and together promote charity, justice and peace. I believe that it is important to note what makes each Denomination unique, and just as important, to focus on what binds us together and how we, as one faith family, live and profess the Gospel of Peace and promote the Kingdom of God.
