"Talking Points" About the Synod

- A synod is more than just a meeting of bishops. It is the People of God "journeying together" as disciples of Jesus, seeking the will of the Holy Spirit for the Church in our time.
- Thus, a synod is a process: a process of prayer, worship, listening to one another and to the Spirit in order that we might all participate in the mission of Jesus in our world.
- Pope Francis, in planning for the next World Synod of Bishops, to be held in Rome in October 2023, has asked the bishops of the world to consult with the entire people of God. He has identified the theme of this Synod as "Communion, Participation, and Mission."
- We desire to be in communion with one another as Church and with God who has revealed the very self of God as Trinity: Father, Son and Spirit.
- We desire that all the people of God participate in the mission of the Church, which is the mission of Jesus to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ and to witness to the presence of the Risen Christ in our world.
- The first phase of this process for us in the Diocese of Syracuse consists of Listening Sessions, to be held throughout the diocese in the various pastoral care areas between now and the end of March. The goal of these Listening Sessions is to provide you with the opportunity to gather with the People of God and to speak freely, boldly, and courageously from your heart to Bishop Lucia about what is going well in our diocese and in your parish, and what you would like to see improved. Bishop Lucia will be present at all Listening Sessions!
- It is very important to note that ALL are welcome...parishioners, friends, those who attend Church regularly and those who for whatever reason may no longer be doing so...as well as other Christians and members of other religions.
- You are free to attend any listening session. A complete list of Listening Sessions can be found in the Catholic SUN and on the Diocesan Website. The list will be updated as more sessions are scheduled.
- Our Diocesan Synod will be held during the Spring of 2024; this is just the first step on our journey together.
