

Fasting For Lent

Dear Parish Family,

Another traditional Lenten practice is fasting. Fasting is much more than simply not eating large meals; it is a way to remind us that we are both physical and spiritual beings. In a society that promotes instant gratification for all of our physical appetites and desires, it is important for us to remember that there is more to us and to life than satisfying our physical cravings. We should also remember that there is nothing wrong or sinful about our physical nature and appetites as long as these do not become disordered and lead us to ignore or even deny our spiritual nature or become the occasion for sin.

Fasting is a way to encourage temperance and self control and help us to appreciate all the gifts that God gives to us and how truly blessed we are.

While most of us have been hungry, few if any of us have ever experienced true hunger or starvation as so many in the world do. There are many of our brothers and sisters who do not know when or if they will have another meal. Fasting can help us to become more sensitive to and have empathy with all those who are truly in need and remind us that we are all one human family created by our God and Father in his Divine image.



Lenten Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence

Days of Abstinence: No meat can be eaten on Ash Wednesday and all of the Fridays during Lent. This applies to all Catholics 14 and older.

Days to Fast: Only one full meal is permitted on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for Catholics between 18 and 59. Two smaller meals are permitted, but the small meals should not equal a second full meal. Drinking coffee, tea and water between meals is allowed. Snacks between meals are not allowed. *One is not bound to fast if health or the ability to work is affected.*
