May, the Month of Mary

Dear Parish Family,

Who is Mary; and what do Catholics believe about her? We believe that Mary is the Mother of Jesus and as such is the Mother of God; she is the mother of the Son, the Spouse of the Holy Spirit and the daughter of the Father, and the Mother of the Church. Mary however is not divine, we do not adore nor do we worship Mary; we do however venerate her as one whose life is truly exemplary and worthy of praise. As Catholics, we profess Mary's Immaculate Conception: that is in virtue of who her Son was to be, by a singular act of grace God preserved Mary from all stain of original sin from the first moment of her conception. We also profess the virginity of Mary, before, during and ever after the birth of Jesus Christ her Son. We also profess that at the end of her earthly life Mary was Assumed Body and Soul into heaven. When we pray we are encouraged to ask Mary to pray with and for us. "Because of Mary's singular cooperation with the action of the Holy Spirit, the Church loves to pray in communion with the Virgin Mary, to magnify with her the great things the Lord has done for her and to entrust supplications and praises to her." We commemorate Mary at various times throughout the Liturgical year; specifically December 8, the Feast of the immaculate Conception (the patronal feast of our Diocese and our Nation), March 25, the Feast of the Annunciation and August 15, the Feast of Mary's Assumption into Heaven.
