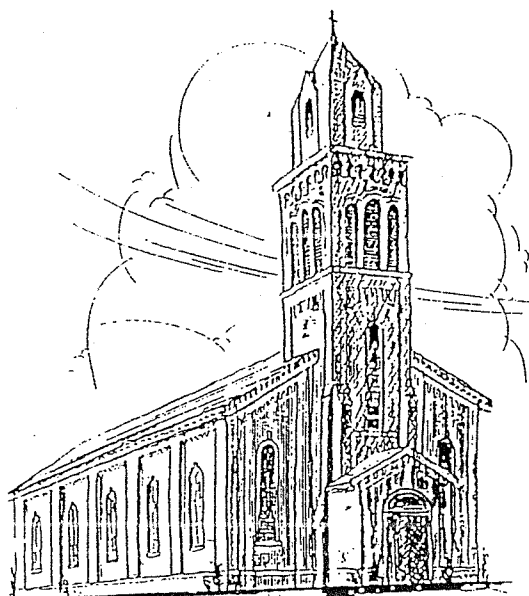

Respect All Life

Once again there is an attempt in the New York State legislature to make assisted suicide legal. Assisted Suicide (also called euthanasia or mercy killing) is nothing other than MURDER. It is the same as killing an infant in the womb, abortion or any other act of violence against the dignity and sanctity of human life. We profess and believe that each human life, without condition or exception, is of infinite dignity, value and worth; all human life is created in the Divine image and likeness, and we are redeemed by the precious Blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. There are those who claim assisted suicide is an act of mercy for one who is suffering. The fact is that, as I have been told by hospice workers, there is no reason in our society for anyone to have to endure undo pain, given the advances of medical technology. There is also the claim that the ill person may cause an undue burden, financially, emotionally, or psychologically on the family. Are our families really so shallow or selfish that we cannot care for an ill loved one? There are many groups and organizations that are there specifically to help families in this time of need. There is another argument that a person may no longer be of value to the society; this presupposes that a person's dignity and value is only determined by what he or she is able to contribute to the society; again we believe that human life has an inherent dignity that does not depend on ability or acts of the individual. God, and only God, is the author of life; not the society or state! However, we humans like to 'play' God. We have been doing so ever since the beginning. The serpent tempted them. "For God knows that when you eat the fruit of the tree your eyes will be opened and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." (Genesis 3:5). What then should we do? Contact your sState legislators and tell them to oppose and vote no to this heinous, diabolical bill. If we remain silent, we give our tacit consent and will be morally responsible for our silence.
