

From the Pastor *The Mystery of Faith* Dear Parish Family, This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity: our faith professes that we believe in

One God (Monotheism) who is the Three Divine Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Equal in Divinity, Majesty, and Being. This is one of the greatest mysteries of the Christian Faith; sometimes referred to as the 'Mysterium Tremendum.' This mystery, as all divine mysteries, are beyond our limited human ability to grasp or understand; yet in faith we accept what God has made known to us. Faith, is one of the Theological Virtues (along with Hope and Love) is defined in the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "Faith: this theological virtue enables us to believe in God, all that God has said and revealed to us, and all that the Church proposes for our belief because God is truth itself.
