Missionary Discipleship Dear Parish Family,

As we welcome Fr. Augustine Mbiche to our parish for our annual Missionary Appeal, I am reminded that Pope Francis has called us all to Missionary Discipleship. A Family Perspective by Bud Ozar: Parenting is a lot like the story of the farmer in the gospel parable today. All growth is the Lord's work. We have no control over the process. In fact the farmer doesn't even understand it, for the seed grows even when he sleeps. As parents we can influence our children but nothing we do can guarantee results.

Father's Day Sunday Extra: It is interesting we call the first person of the Trinity, Father. Our dads help us understand God as Father in the way they love, protect, teach, discipline and spend time with us. What an awesome responsibility, to be the window through which children view God.

IT TAKES A MAN

It takes a man to be a father:

to discipline his child through the inner life of the spirit rather than by the brute force of his hand;

to listen and to share his time and energy even when he is weary or busy with his own interests;

to be sensitive to his child's needs and pain rather than concerned with his own image and ego;

to be able to admit a mistake or a failure and ask forgiveness and understanding;

to be patient, honest, open, while acknowledging his own impatience, prejudices, frustrations and the anger and pain of knowing he is less than what he wants to be;

to take his child into his arms with a loving embrace when broken relationships need to be healed;

to love his child's spontaneity, just as he or she is, rather than demand predetermined and patterned responses;

to celebrate with his child the spirit of God as they together find it in the beauty of dawn, the breeze caressing their faces, the exhilaration of running, the touch of a hand, the quiet glow of shared love;

to see in the child the man or woman the child will become and be grateful for the opportunity to share in the growing up.
