Corpus Christi - The Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ

Dear Parish Family, The feast celebrates our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We believe that after the consecration at Mass, the Bread and Wine become actually, literally and completely; the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. This is not a simple memorial, sign, symbol, image or representation of Jesus. The Eucharist is TRULY Jesus' Body and Blood. The same Jesus who was Born in Bethlehem, Died on the Cross, Resurrected, Ascended and who will return at the end of time. Why do we believe in the Real Presence in the Eucharist? First, if you believe that Jesus is God; then it follows that He has authority over creation (which came to be through Him). Ath the Last Supper Jesus proclaims: "Take and eat, this is my Body, take and drink this is my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant. In John's Gospel 6: 51 ff we read: I am the living bread

come down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. ... Amen, Amen I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood will have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood true drink." Now, as then, there are those who deny this truth, those who ask "How can this man give us his flesh to eat? The answer is really simple and a gift of faith. Jesus loves us so much that He chose to make Himself available to us until the end of time, in a very real and tangible way. How incredible is our God, and how much does He love us that He wants to be with us always! God Bless, Fr. Dan
