Some Catholic Things
Why do we do what we do?

Dear parish family,

Many non-Catholics and even some Catholics have questions about why we Catholics use the gesture and postures that we use. Over the next few weeks I will talk about some of them.

First: as you enter a Catholic Church, you will find the Holy Water font. This water initially is blessed at the Easter Vigil. When we enter Church, the custom is to Bless oneself with Holy Water, this is called the Blessing of the Pre-Sanctified and is a reminder, as we enter the Church of our Baptism. You may have noticed that the Holy Water fonts are empty from Palm Sunday to the Easter Vigil, so that the 'New Water' of Easter can be used. (They were empty during the Pandemic and at times during Flu season as a health precaution.)

Second: Why do we genuflect or bow before the Blessed Sacrament? A genuflection or bow before the Blessed Sacrament is a gesture of reverence and respect for the presence of our Euchatistic Lord in the Tabernacle. We know that the Blessed Sacrament is present in the Tabernacle when the Sanctuary Lamp (the candle on the wall to the right in the Sanctuary) is lit. This is lit throughout the year and is extinguished only at the end of the Holy Thursday Evening Mass of the Holy Euchatist and is re-lit during the Easter Vigil. This symbolizes the fact that the Tabernacle is empty from Holy Thursday Night until the Easter Vigil. The Blessed Sacrament has been transferred to the Repository where it will remain until the Vigil. The custom of visiting Churches on Holy Thursday night to pray where the Blessed Sacrament has been transferred is an ancient and venerable custom. God Bless, Fr. Dan
