Justice and Mercy Dear Parish Family, Two of the most mis-understood attributes of our God are justice and mercy; they are like two sides of a

coin, one does not exist in God without the other. Justice is the attempt to promote the well being of all, including oneself. This is very different from the idea of justice in our society. Usually when one proclaims: "No justice, no peace" or "Justice for (include any person, cause, or group)", they really mean that they want revenge. They want punishment for the person or group that they perceive to be perpetrators or offenders. Wanting 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for tooth' which according to Gandhi only leaves the world blind and toothless. This is not the teaching of justice that comes from Jesus. God's justice looks to correct the offense while giving the perpetrator an opportunity to repent and be restored to full community. God's justice never pretends wrong is right or that sin is not sin, yet it holds out hope or repentance and reconciliation; it does not seek revenge. This is where God's mercy comes into play. Jesus tells us that we should forgive, 'seventy times seventy times'; that we should forevie as our Father has forgiven us, as we pray in the Lord's Prayer, we ask God to forgive us as we forgive others. We are all sinners, I am, you are; and yet God has forgiven us time and time again; even on the Cross Jesus prayed: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." How much happier and truly peaceful would our lives and society be, if we abandon the call for revenge and truly embrace the Justice and Mercy of God. God Bless, Fr. Dan
