<u>Missionary Appeal</u> <u>Welcome, Fr. Innocent</u>

Fr. Innocent Ejike Onyenagubo will be here this weekend, for the annual Missionary Appeal.

Fr. Innocent, who is the Priest Chaplain at Upstate University Hospital and Hutchings

Mental Health Center in Syracuse, is the Ahiara Diocesan representative in the Central NY area.

Ahiara-Mbaise Diocese:

Is one of the most rural dioceses in Nigeria. It is one of the Southern poorest areas of the nation. There, the government does not help to provide the people with the basic necessities of life and the people have no one to speak for them, except the Bishop/priests and the Church. In this area, there is **no good food provision**,

no good water and no electricity. There are no hospitals and no health care provision of any kind. Many people die in this community every day due to preventable and curable diseases.

There will be a second collection at all Masses this weekend for the Missionary Appeal.

Dear Parish Family, This weekend Father Innocent speaks with us about the Mission Appeal. Below is further information about the Ahiara Mbaise Diocese

Nigeria: The SuperPower of Africa with a population of three hundred million people. This West African nation was the Light of Africa some years ago with crude oil and other mineral resources. The richest of the African nations, is today one of the most dangerous and most corrupt/poorest nations of the world. There is a great divide in Nigeria between the North and the South. The Northern/Muslims have controlled the political power of the nation all the years of her independence (Oct. 1st 1960). The Southern/Christian Communities have suffered great persecution and marginalization from the Islamic leadership of Nigeria.

Boko Haram Is a group of Islamic blood-thirsty extremists in Nigeria. They go about killing innocent Christians. Their military equipment is stronger than the Nigerian military's. There is fear in the life of every Christian faithful and their families. People are afraid to get out of their rooms. There is high rate of insecurity everywhere in the country. The political leaders are doing nothing to stop the evil in the land. **Boko Haram** sees Western Education and women's education as evil and forbidden. Their aim is to Islamize the country - every Nigerian citizen must become a Muslim or be killed.

Fulani Herdsmen/tribe: Are Islamic terrorists who came into Nigeria from Islamic nations of West Africa claiming that Nigeria is their land and have come to possess it. This group goes about killing farmers and other workers in their farmlands and workplaces. About 20 Catholic priests have been kidnapped and killed by this anti-Christian group in the past few months. The **Fulani tribe** dominates the political power of the nation.

The Unknown Gunmen: This group of terrorists go about in military uniforms kidnapping and beheading innocent Nigerian Christians after calling for ransom. They operate in the South of Nigeria, mostly. This situation is worsened by **COVID-19 Pandemic**, which has sent many to the grave without people knowing of it. The situation in Nigeria today is worse than what goes on in Ukraine except that cities are not yet destroyed.

Our Mission Goal this year is to fight insecurity, hunger, and thirst in the Ahiara-Mbaise community.
