

### A Very Important Right

Dear Parish Family,

A very important THRIVAL RIGHT (one necessary to achieve one's full

potential as a human person) is the right to participate in the decisions that affect us. In our republic, we exercise this right most importantly by our voting. I would make the moral argument that voting is not only a right that we enjoy, but a moral obligation that we each have. I am concerned however, that during this election season the rhetoric has gotten out of hand, we resort to name calling and the cult of personality. We should vote, but not simply because we like or dislike a person. (This is not Middle School when the most popular person won simply because they were most popular); the future is too important to be reduced to a personality or popularity contest. As Catholics we should vote according to our individual conscience; but this conscience must be informed; not by who is the loudest or most popular, or by media hype; but by the positions of our Catholic Faith. We should make it our business and responsibility to find out what positions, what platforms, what policies are most in line with what we believe; our vote does have consequences both for us and for our children and grandchildren. Vote, but vote intelligently and rationally for the positions that uphold what we, as Catholics, truly believe. Again, we in this country are fortunate that our vote is private, no one has the right to know for whom or what positions I voted; and I have no obligation to share or justify my decisions with anyone other than Almighty God. ### **Adoration**

As your pastor there is a concern that I must share with you concerning First Friday *Adoration and Benediction*. When we first began this practice there was no

Benediction attendance has dropped off to just three this past Friday. I need to remind us all that there is a great spiritual benefit and blessing from spending one hour in prayer before the Eucharistic Lord: for the individual, their family and their parish. There is also a great spiritual benefit from Benediction, receiving the Blessing of our Eucharistic Lord. However, if this parish family no longer wants monthly First Friday Adoration and Benediction and is not willing or able to support this beautiful prayer with time, then I will have no choice than to stop First Friday Adoration and Benediction. If you feel that this is important, and you want this beautiful prayerful practice to continue at St. Francis Xavier, then please contact the Rectory and let us know of your willingness to give your time (one hour on a Friday, once a month) and then about 30 min. on that evening for Benediction.
