

Dear Parish Family, I don't know about you, but I am sick and tired of our Catholic Christian faith being mocked, ridiculed and outright slandered in our modern world. For me, the final straw was the absolutely blasphemous and sacrilegious display at the opening ceremony of the Paris Olympics. Our Catholic faith and values are depicted as outdated, outmoded and reactionary; opposed to modern 'progressive' values. In fact, true faith supports and values all that upholds the dignity and value of human life, true respect for others and the absolute Majesty and Authority of God. If you would like a Mass offered for someone that you have lost, particularly on the anniversary of their death or birthday, please call the parish office to schedule that Mass. Remember, the greatest thing that we can do for someone who has died is to prayer for them, and the Mass is the greatest of all prayers.
