#### A Note from Fr. Dan:

As students are getting ready to go back to school, I began thinking about my own first days as a child; especially my first grade experience. We all took religion and the text that we used was the Baltimore Catechism. This Catechism taught by question and answers that we were required to commit to memory. I still can recall much of it and I am especially aware of the first two questions and answers.

Question 1: Who made me? Answer 1: God made me.

Question 2: Why did God make me?

Answer 2: God made me to know, love and serve Him in this world and to be eternally happy with Him in the next.

These simple truths are as powerful today as they were then!

God created each of us in His own Divine image and likeness. We are intentionally, purposefully created as an act of Divine Love. We are not accidents; we are not simply random masses of universal atoms and molecules. We are created by a God who does so out of love.

Each of us has a purpose in our lives. To use our intellect to know God. We do this by studying our faith; prayer, reading Scripture and celebrating the Sacraments and being a part of our faith community. In these ways we develop a relationship with God and His people. We can experience God's love for us (especially in Jesus) and choose to love God, in our own limited human way. We live our love for God in obedience to Him and service to the Church and the world. Ultimately, God created us for Himself: to share eternity with Him in His Kingdom, Heaven.

There is a lot to say for the things that I was taught in First Grade, and they become more and more important for me to reflect on as I get older. God Bless, Fr. Dan
