From the Partor Dear Parish Family, Important August Feasts Sometimes our Catholic feasts are taken for granted and come and go

without much reflection; I believe that when we stop and reflect on the mysteries of our faith, we will truly be renewed in the Spirit and inspired on our own faith journey. Two that I would like to focus on this week are August 6, the feast of the Transfiguration, and August 15, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The Transfiguration of Jesus is filled with Scriptural and spiritual meaning. Peter, James and John are given a glimpse of Jesus' glory as God to strengthen them for the coming Passion and Death of Christ. Appearing with Jesus are Moses and Elijah, reminding us that Jesus and His life and Mission fulfill all of the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah); also, Jewish Law required two witnesses for a testimony to be held up as legally valid, when they hear the words of the Father, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased, listen to Him" and the Holy Spirit descends like a dove; the testimony is validated. A similar expression by God is found at the baptism of Jesus.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary -

Long before this was an official doctrine to the Church, it was held, both in the Eastern and Western church, and taught by the Church Fathers. The teaching is that, because of who her Son is, and by a singular gift of grace, because Mary was free from all sin, her body didn't decay, nor did she experience death. God took her into heaven, body and soul, as the first and preeminent disciple and member of the Church, and Mother of all the faithful.

The mysteries of our Faith and the activity of our God in human history and in our own lives is truly awe inspiring and wonderful. We need to take the time to stop, reflect, and appreciate how truly good and loving our God is to us. God Bless,
