A Note from Fr. Dan

Dear Parish Family, Clouded in the Carols, Cards and Nativity Scenes, we can forget that Jesus, Mary and Joseph were a real family, not just idealized versions of what it means to be a family. Consider what they experienced: Mary and Joseph's marriage was arranged. Joseph was considerably older than Mary and after their betrothal, Joseph finds out that Mary is with child, and knows the child is not his; He decided to divorce Mary quietly so that she would not face the penalty imposed by the Mosaic Law. An angel was sent to reassure him that the child was of God, not adultery. When Mary was nine months pregnant they had to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem (a journey of nine days by foot and donkey) to fulfill the Roman edict that each man return to his ancestral home for a census. They slept outside. When they arrived in Bethlehem, Mary went into labor, the only place they could stay was a cold stable where Mary gave birth to the child, Jesus. Immediately, the Holy Family had to flee to Egypt to escape Herod's attempt to kill the Child. They stayed in Egypt until the death of Herod, and then returned to Nazareth. We hear nothing of the Holy Family again until Jesus was twelve and as devout jews they went up to Jerusalem, to celebrate Passover in the Temple. Jesus stayed in Jerusalem while his parents thought he was with the group, a parent's worst nightmare when they found that he was missing. Hurrying back to Jerusalem they found Jesus in the Temple. Then Jesus set out to begin His public ministry at thirty; it is assumed Joseph had already died. The ultimate family horror was when Mary stood at the foot of the Cross to be with her Son as she was crucified and died. Like any family, the Holy Family had joys and struggles that by the grace of God and their mutual love they were able to survive. Every family is called to imitate the Holy Family. Not only is the family the basic foundation of society, it is also called the “Domestic Church”; the place where mutual love is shared, real life is lived and the next generation can learn the value of true self-giving sacrificial love, respect, dignity for self and others and the need to forgive and be forgiven and the true value of faith Catholic Engaged Encounter has a saying that is very appropriate here: "The best thing a parent can do for the child is to love their spouse". God bless all families, no matter size or make up, you are a blessing and model to us all. God Bless, Fr. Dan
