A Note from Fr. Dan

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi:

The Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ

Last week we celebrated a Solemnity uniquely Christian: The Most Holy Trinity. This week's Solemnity is foundational to the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches. The Feast of Corpus Christi: the Most Holy Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ, is the celebration of our firm and essential belief in the real presence of Jesus our Risen, Ascended and Eucharist Lord. in the great gift of the Holy Eucharist.

Our faith proclaims that Jesus Christ is truly, really present in the Eucharist, each time the bread and wine is consecrated by the priest, it becomes actually, literally and completely the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ; the Second Person of the Most Blessed Trinity.

The Eucharist is not a sacramental like holy water, blessed and consecrated oil, rosaries, or other objects used for religious devotion.

The Eucharist is not a holy object or thing; it becomes by the power of the Holy Spirit truly Jesus Christ; although it still has the appearance of bread and wine; it no longer is, but, rather, Jesus Christ, Himself. The Eucharist is not simply a remembrance of Jesus, or a sign of Jesus, but it is Jesus.

There are those who deny the real presence; but then they are either ignoring or denying the words of Jesus: "Amen, Amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life; and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food and my blood true drink." (John 6: 53-55).

There are those who question how is this possible.? If you acknowledge Jesus as God, and that all creation came through Him, and has life because of Him, It logically follows that Jesus, in His Divinity, can certainly change the nature of something that already exists; if He cannot, simply He is not God.
