A Note from Fr. Dan

Advent: a new beginning

Dear Parish Family,

Our lives are directed by many different calendars: the secular calendar, Jan 1 - Dec. 31, the Fiscal calendar July 1-June 30, and for many families the school calendar directs our lives. As Catholics there is another Calendar that is important; that is the Liturgical Calendar which gives the dates of Holy Days, Solemnities, feast and memorials marked in our Eucharistic celebrations and daily prayer. Our Liturgical calendar begins with Advent. Advent is a beautiful Liturgical season unto itself; not just the days before the celebration of Christmas. Advent does in fact prepare us Liturgically for the Birth of Christ, but it also helps us focus on our faith conviction that Jesus Christ will return at the end of time; it also can help us to prepare for the coming of Jesus into our individual lives, here and now and at the end of our life on this earth. The Scripture of Advent focuses upon the great Prophets of the New Scripture as they looked forward to the restoration of Israel and the coming of the Messiah. The Advent Liturgy focuses on St. John the Baptist, the Precursor of Christ, and the Virgin Mary, whose yes to God and obedience to His Word and Will brought about the Incarnation. While there is great excitement about Christmas, but liturgically, we will light the Advent candles on the wreath, and secularly, we should never forget the great gift of Advent, the gift of quiet, peaceful (even in the midst of the hectic secular business) calm as we proclaim: "Come, Lord Jesus!" For four weeks symbolic of the compilating of the fullness of time, the Gloria is not proclaimed, Gaudete Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent when the Rose vestments are worn and the Baby Jesus' from creches are blessed; and we finally arrive at the Feast of the Birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ. So the Church waits; in excited anticipation for the fulfillment of the Prophets of Israel, the joy of the Virgin Mary at the birth of her child. God Bless,


