Mary, the Mother of God  
Dear Parish Family,  
October is the month of the Rosary; a beautiful prayer which allows us to meditate the mysteries of Salvation History; from the Annunciation through the public ministry of Jesus, His Passion, Death and Resurrection and Ascension. We also spend time pondering the role of Mary as an integral person in the life of Jesus as His Mother and ultimately Mary's Assumption and Crowning as Queen of Heaven and earth. So, just what does the Catholic Church teach about Mary? First: Mary is not God, she is not Divine, we do not worship Mary, we do, however venerate Mary; with deep love and respect as the Mother of God and the Mother of the Church. (CCC # 509-511) Mary is truly the "Mother of God" since she is the mother of the eternal Son of God made man, who is God himself. Mary remained a virgin in conceiving her Son (by the power of the Holy Spirit) a virgin in giving birth, a virgin in carrying Him, a virgin nursing Him at her breast, always a virgin: with her whole being she is the handmaid of the Lord. (CCC # 490-491) To become the mother of the Savior Mary was enriched by God with gifts appropriate to her role. Mary, 'full of grace' through God, was redeemed from the moment of her conception. That is what the dogma of the Immaculate Conception confesses. (CCC # 971) The devotion given to Mary, the Mother of God differs essentially from the adoration given to the Incarnate Word, and equally to the Father and the Holy Spirit, and greatly fosters this adoration. (CCC # 966) finally, the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of Lords and conqueror of sin and death. The assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians. "Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us." God Bless, Fr. Dan
