## A Note from Fr. Dan

### Forgiveness

Dear Parish Family,  
Forgiveness is one of those things that can be very difficult; however, forgiveness is one of the ways we can imitate God's goodness and graciousness to us. Every human person needs forgiveness; both from God and from others. Every human person needs to be able to extend forgiveness. Forgiveness does not pretend that an offense or a hurt has taken place; it does, however, allow the rift to heal, broken relations to be healed and the burden of guilt to be lifted. God's forgiveness of our sinfulness and sin took place once and for all on the cross when Jesus offered Himself as an expiation for our sins. His passion and death allows us the freedom to be truly contrite (acknowledge that we have sinned and, with the help of God's grace not to sin again.) God does not hold a grudge, or keep a tally sheet. We read in the Book of the Prophet Isaiah 1:18: "Though your sins be red as scarlet, I will make them as white as snow." Sometimes, we humans are not like that; we say we forgive, but still hold a grudge. It takes great humility to ask to be forgiven, to acknowledge that we have done wrong, or hurt another. It takes grace to extend forgiveness and not hold a grudge or hold it over the other person's head. Forgiveness liberates both the one asking for forgiveness and the one seeking to be forgiven. As people of faith, we profess that we must forgive in the way God has forgiven us, and if we do not forgive, we are asking God not to forgive us. (Remember the Lord's prayer: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.") Also Jesus teaches His disciples that there should be no measure or limit to our forgiveness. "Then Peter came up and said to him, 'Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?'" Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven."
