A Note from Fr. Dan

Indulgences

Dear Parish Family,

In my homily for All Souls Day, I mentioned the indulgences one can receive for their deceased loved ones and friends. Many Catholics may not know that there is such a reality as Indulgences; and those who do may not fully understand what they are. This weekend, using the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) I'll explain the Church's teaching concerning indulgences. "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian, duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with the authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints. An indulgence is partial or plenary as it removes part of all of the temporal punishment due to sin. The faithful can gain indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead (CCC1471). The forgiveness of sin and restoration of communion with God entail the remission of eternal punishment of sin, but temporal punishment of sin remains (CCC 1473). These two punishments (spiritual and temporal) must not be conceived as a kind of vengeance inflicted by God from without, but following from the very nature of sin (CCC1472). An indulgence is obtained through the Church who, by virtue of the power of binding and loosing granted to her by Jesus Christ, intervenes in favor of the individual Christians and opens for them the treasury of the merits of Christ and the saints to obtain from the Father of mercies the remission of the temporal punishment due to their sins. The Church does not simply want to come to the aid of these Christians, but also to spur them to works of devotion, penance, and charity. (CCC1478)" The usual conditions for obtaining an indulgence include: Sacramental confession, worthy reception of the Eucharist, and a firm desire and desire to abstain for all sin. God Bless, Fr.
